MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

The National Association of Broadcasters (NAB)¹ hereby requests that the Federal Communications Commission grant an extension of the deadlines for the submission of comments and reply comments in response to the *Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking* ("*FNPRM*") in the above-captioned proceeding.² Comments are currently due on May 12, 2014, and reply comments are due on June 9, 2014. NAB respectfully requests a 45-day extension of these deadlines until Thursday, June 26, 2014, for comments and Thursday, July 24, 2014, for reply comments.

NAB requests this extension of time to ensure that it and other interested parties are able to respond fully to the many important questions raised in the *FNPRM*. The *FNPRM* seeks a variety of empirical data—including economic and financial data—about the current network nonduplication and syndicated exclusivity rules and the potential impact of the elimination of these rules on television broadcast licensees and television viewers. NAB anticipates that it will need to retain expert economists or other analysts in
