There are more than 15,000 local radio and television stations in the United States, employing nearly 250,000 hard working Americans. These stations serve their communities through public service, local news, entertaining programming and vital community information – such as emergency warnings, traffic information and severe weather alerts. NAB advocates on behalf of these stations before Congress and the federal government, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the general public.

As you may know, on February 17, 2009, all full power television stations will transition from analog to digital broadcasting. We are working hard for a smooth and effective digital television (DTV) transition so that the 19 million Americans who depend on free, over-the-air television can continue to receive a broadcast signal after the transition. Overall, the transition will affect nearly 70 million televisions in households across the country, so in our massive consumer education efforts, we've worked with all branches of the government and across all demographics to ensure no American is left unaware of the switch to DTV.
