REQUEST TO DELAY SUNSHINE PERIOD

The National Association of Broadcasters (NAB)¹ respectfully requests that the Commission grant a two day delay (until the close of business on Tuesday, April 24, 2012) in the imposition of the sunshine period in the above-captioned proceeding.


Certain of the proposals in this proceeding (particularly those involving placing broadcasters' political files online) have proved controversial and difficult to resolve. Discussions between broadcasters, Commissioners and FCC staff about these proposals continued during the NAB Show in Las Vegas, which ended only yesterday. Because the Commission agenda meeting is scheduled for April 27, 2012, the sunshine period prohibition is scheduled to come into effect for this proceeding later today, April 20, 2012. NAB hereby requests a two business day delay of the imposition of the sunshine period (until close of business on April 24, 2012) to permit interested parties to
