Dear Senator Smith, Mr. Newberry and Ms. Bendall:

The Performance Rights Act has been reported favorably out of the House and Senate Judiciary Committees. We request that your organizations, as representatives of the stakeholders most affected by the provisions of this legislation, enter into negotiations before this legislation is considered on the floor of either House. The negotiated resolution will be considered by Congress as it takes up passage of this Act.

The negotiations will be led by Members and staff of the Judiciary Committees, taking into consideration issues important to both sides. Chairman Waxman is also supportive of this effort and will be included in the negotiations. We ask that you select representatives with decision-making authority to appear on November 17, 2009 at 10 a.m. in room HC-7 of the Capitol to begin these negotiations. The negotiations will continue through December 1, 2009. We will request a recommendation from Committee Members and staff resulting from the negotiations.
