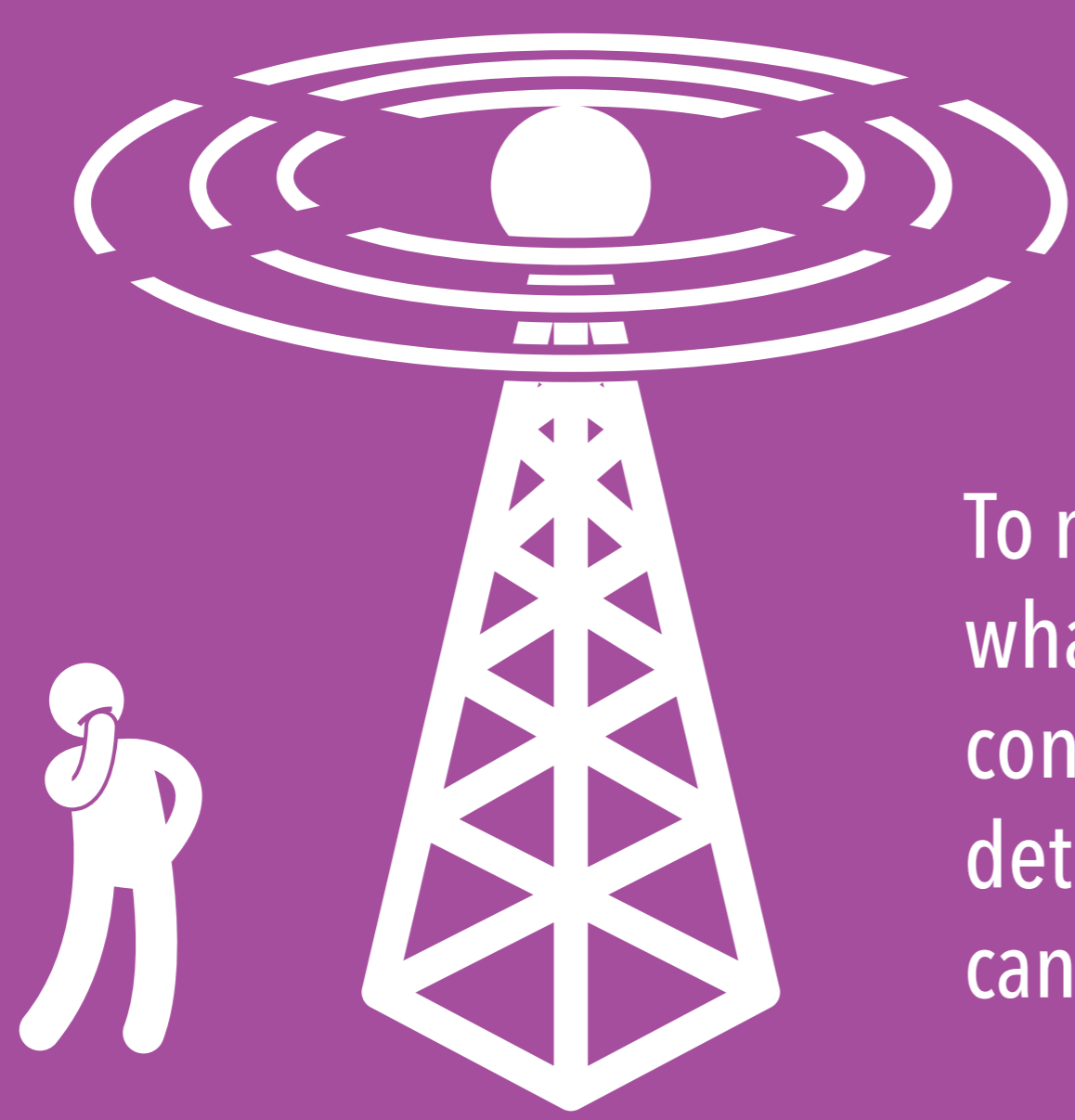


TELEVISION STATIONS ARE MOVING CHANNELS. FIND OUT HOW.



By law, TV stations must move channels to make room for wireless services. How does a station move frequencies? It's not as easy as you may think...



1

To move, a station must assess what new hardware and construction is needed, and determine if the current tower can support the new hardware.

2

Coordinate with other stations that may share its tower.



3

Order and pay for the hardware, without promise of full reimbursement from the government.

4

Reinforce its tower if necessary, requiring zoning permits, time and money.

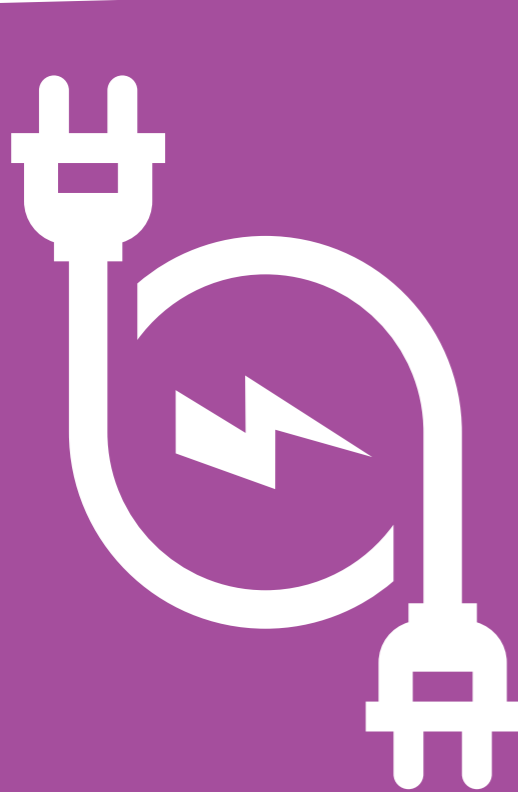


Have a new antenna designed, manufactured and delivered.

Contract with one of the few qualified tower crews to make infrastructure improvements.



Power down (or go off air for a short period of time) and hope for good weather (no wind, rain or snow) so tower work can be completed.

7

All of this must happen in a short period of time designated by the government or the station may go dark.
